History of Spectrum

Spectrum Queer Choir is a non-auditioned community choir that creates a place of celebration, belonging, and safety for 2SLGBTQIA+ people. We welcome all who wish to join regardless of experience, ability, or identity. Together, we seek justice, growth, and connection through our music-making that enriches our lives and the culture of Newfoundland and Labrador.

In the spring of 2011, choir founder Alice Hietala was finishing her first year of graduate studies in choral conducting at Memorial University's School of Music. Having moved from Ontario and searching for her place in a city that would soon become her forever home, Alice realized that in a community with such rich choral traditions, there were no 2SLGBTQIA+ choirs. So she decided to start one. That fall, forty people showed up to the first rehearsal and the choir hasn't looked back since.

In our ten years, the choir has enjoyed many opportunities to sing, educate, and celebrate, including with such organizations as St. John's Pride, TEDx St. John's, PODIUM Choral Conference and Festival, and Egale's OUTShine GSA Youth Conference. We are proud of what we have achieved and now, with ten years under our belt, we set our sights on Halifax as we prepare for our first trip to the Unison Choral Festival in the summer 2023 where we will join with 2SLGBTQIA+ choruses from across Canada.

Alice Hietala (she/her) - Artistic Director

Alice Hietala is a choral musician and passionate queer community activist. After earning a Bachelor of Music Education from Western University and Masters of Choral Conducting from Memorial University, she founded Spectrum Queer Choir. Based on her experience as a choral artist and queer woman, Alice has led many workshops and presentations exploring 2SLGBTQIA+ choral voices with local and national organizations. Pursuing a career as a community worker, Alice completed a diploma in Social Service Work at George Brown College and now works as a sexual health educator with Planned Parenthood - NLSHC. Alice seeks to empower queer voices, to nurture our choral culture, and build spaces of empowerment, celebration, and support through music.

Mado Christie (they/them) - Accompanist

Mado Christie is a collaborative pianist, chamber musician, and vocal coach. They have performed in all of these different capacities across North America. Born in Toronto to musician parents, Mado has been surrounded by music their entire life. They studied with acclaimed pianist Peter Longworth and went on to pursue their undergraduate degree in Piano Performance at the University of Toronto in the studio of Marietta Orlov. Following that, Mado completed their Masters in Vocal Accompanying at the Manhattan School of Music, where they studied with Kenneth Merrill. Mado moved to St. John's in 2017, and has since then had the pleasure of working as a collaborative pianist with students at Memorial University's School of Music, as well as collaborating with many other musicians and arts organizations in the city.
